## EMPOWER. UCM's Progreso Center for Literacy & Citizenship: A Wonderful Place to Grow and Thrive

For people to achieve and maintain stability, continued learning and career development are essential. Our clients work hard to move beyond limited skills and literacy, to achieve self-sufficiency — and a brighter future.

Early this year, the programs of Progreso Center for Literacy & Citizenship were integrated with UCM. Cristina Schoendorf, former Progreso executive director, is now UCM's Director of Literacy and Work. ESL courses and classes that provide a path to U.S. citizenship continue at Progreso's 4100 Mohawk Lane office. Conversation and tutoring sessions take place at various locations including Sherwood Hall Library.

Thanks to our dedicated trained volunteers, every year 200+ non-English speakers receive comprehensive, affordable and accessible ESL and citizenship instruction. Our services inspire life-long changes by helping immigrants gain access to skills and programs that reduce poverty and promote self-sufficiency.

Maria and her husband Alberto moved from Venezuela several years ago to be closer to their adult daughter and their grandchildren. They are working toward their U.S. citizenship. "The volunteer teachers here are friendly and very helpful," says Alberto.
