Program Spotlight:

Creating Bright Futures for Teen Moms & Their Children

Jennifer has had a lot to celebrate recently. Her toddler son is thriving and on track with all developmental milestones. She graduated from high school and now has a full-time job at a restaurant in Lorton, where she had been working part-time. She has plans for community college and is determined to make a good life for herself and her young son.

Jennifer is one of five Project Opportunity mothers who have children at UCM's Bryant Early Learning Center and who graduated from high school in February. Project Opportunity is the high school completion program for expecting or parenting young women in Fairfax County. Pat Washington, our Child Development Specialist, conducts a Social Work Assessment and Observation on the children when they enroll, and holds monthly lunch sessions for the moms on parenting skills and other topics.

Pat's eyes light up with enthusiasm as she shares about Ava, another Project Opportunity mother who just graduated. "She has an 8-month-old son at our Center who is thriving," she explains. "She made the Honor Roll and has plans to enroll at the community college. I am so proud of her—



and more important, she is proud of herself."

"The future is so much brighter for these young families because of UCM," says Pat. "In many ways, these parenting teens are no different from other students. We help them deal with the extra responsibilities each juggles to make their child a priority. Our teen moms participate in school clubs and extracurricular activities that build their self-esteem. Several of them have been elected to student government and have made the Honor Roll."

UCM's Bryant Early Learning Center is just one program in UCM's continuum of services that help children grow and thrive, which also includes Healthy Families Fairfax and our after-school programs: Forward Steps and the Computer Learning Center Partnership.
